

Rainbow Chimes, Inc. Early Childhood Education & Care Centers Emergency Evacuation Plan Summary for Huntington Site

In the event of an emergency situation that requires an evacuation of Rainbow Chimes-Huntington Site, one of the following plans shall be implemented. In all situations, the caregiver in charge when evacuating shall:

- Take an accurate attendee list;
 - Account for all children and staff as they board/depart vehicles;
 - Bring any necessary medications/supplies and emergency records;
 - Take a cellular phone if available to be used for emergency notifications.
1. If the emergency environment is confined to the immediate area of the facility, e.g. fire or toxic fumes and the children cannot stay on the premises the children will be brought to one of the following sites, by walking/evacuation crib/possible car transport, where they will remain accompanied by caregivers while family/emergency contacts are notified and arrangements are made for either the transporting home or care taking for the remainder of the day.
 - a. Lawn Street Chapel: Corner Broadway-Greenlawn Rd & Milton Pl. 1/10 mile east of RCI Center. 631-266-2372
 - b. Joshua Baptist Church: 376 Broadway-Greenlawn Road 2/10 mile west of RCI Center. 631-673-6256
 - c. Church of Christ: 1035 Park Avenue 4/10 mile west of the RCI Center. 631-271-3435
 - d. Developmental Disabilities Institute 25 Little Plains Road, Huntington 9/10 mile from the RCI Center. Route we will use: Lantern Ave. (across from RCI Center), right onto DeKalb, left onto Brand to end, right onto Little Plains Rd. DDI's school is on left. 631-266-4400
 2. In the event of exposure to toxic materials or gases and a physical examination is recommended, children will be transported by car or emergency vehicle to Huntington Hospital where they will be examined and family/emergency contacts will be notified.
 3. If the emergency is more widespread and encompasses a larger area such as a neighborhood or several homes, due to a non-confined environmental threat, e.g. toxic fumes from a spill, floodwaters, brush fires, etc. and the children cannot remain in the area, the children will be brought to Developmental Disabilities Institute (address above), by walking/evacuation crib/car or emergency vehicle transportation, where they will remain accompanied by caregiver(s) while family/emergency contacts are notified and arrangements for either transportation home or a continuation of care are made.
 4. In the event of a major environmental hazard that necessitates a larger area evacuation such as several neighborhoods, a city/town or geographical area, due to a large non-confined hazard, e.g. a nuclear incident, earthquake, hurricane, etc., children will be transported to: a Red Cross or other Emergency Authority-designated mass shelter by car or emergency vehicle where they will remain accompanied by caregiver(s) while family/guardian/emergency contacts are notified and arrangements are made for their pick up.

Staff will remain with and care for the children at all times during an event. Attendance will be checked whenever children are moved. Staff will bring any necessary medications, supplies, and emergency records.
